






The Year of Thamar's Book

The first known autobiography in English. Born c 1373, Margery Kempe married a merchant and bore 14 children. Following a vision of Christ, she became prone to ecstatic weeping and was shunned, tormented and even put on trial. However, with encouragement from Julian of Norwich, she undertook pilgrimages and journeyed widely in England, France, and Germany. Her *Book* shows an extraordinary recall over a span of 40 years. Lost for centuries and rediscovered in 1934, this new translation brings her fully and volubly alive for modern readers.

The International Eucharistic Congresses: A Spiritual Odyssey 1881 – 2016


