

A Family's Heroic Witness in an Age of Intolerance

This is the true story of four courageous men who played pivotal roles in the religious and political struggles which nearly ripped England apart, beginning with Henry VIII's break with Rome in the 1530's, through the Wars of the Three Kingdoms, the Restoration of 1660 and beyond.

St Robert Southwell, the Jesuit martyred at the young age of 33; John Hampden, a Puritan member of Parliament who reluctantly fought against King Charles I; his friend and relative the Rev Robert Lenthall left England's shores only to return home disillusioned barely three years later, and another relative, the Speaker of the House of Commons, William Lenthall, who was also St Robert Southwell's uncle. All played their parts in the political and religious upheavals of the times.

1930s Ecumenism Exposed

The received wisdom is that no friendly contact between Anglican and Roman Catholics existed from the Reformation until the Second Vatican Council - with the exception of the Malines Conversations hosted by Cardinal Mercier in Belgium in 1920s. This work conclusively rebuts that assumption.

Based on recently discovered archival material, it describes in detail highly-confidential Conversations on the subject of Reunion which took place in London in the early 1930s between an impressive team of officially-sanctioned Catholic prelates and scholarly, if somewhat eccentric, Anglicans disturbed as much by moral as doctrinal concerns. These Conversations explode the myth that the English hierarchy of the period was uniformly hostile to ecumenical contact.

These ground-breaking discussions challenge us today to re-examine the nature of the church and authority, and to re-assess the objectives of ecumenism.


The First Hundred Years
